For CAC we are staggering terms – David Dupont is representative for social studies this year. His last of a two year term.

Report

Accountability report: Sharon Carroll - new comprehensive report for AISD, pertaining to all of our public and private schools in the area as well as school districts.

- Crockett up to 25% comparative to other schools similar to us, closing the achievement gap. This improvement is due to a reboot of standards based grading
- Post-secondary readiness Crockett received a distinction.
- The whole district was 1 point away from an A, scoring *89 out of 100* in the 2018 State Academic Accountability Results.
- 95.3% graduation rate. District has given extra support for graduation coaches. Michael Hidalgo is Crockett's graduation coach.

Campus Improvement Plan (CIP) is ready.

Reviewed CIP in meeting, found amendments, corrected.

Social/emotional learning: Thursdays are classroom walk-throughs. Kori Crawford can pull up the Google doc, see which teachers is in it. More teachers are incorporating SEL into instructions.

Pg 11 - kids feeling safe?

- Constant push about peace. Core values, with many different students, talking about it
 in advisory. Social/emotional leadership pathway. Promote general climate of safety and
 concern, Will start feeling safer. As these restorative circles out of restorative justice.
 Want people to feel better at the end instead of school to prison pipeline. Forgive for
 parents' mistakes. Parents really are not trying to restrict kids, just errors based upon
 safety desires and love.
- Babette Alotto In my advisory, I've known all the kids since they were freshmen. Nobody would say a word. Now that just juniors, instead of seniors and juniors together, responding more.
- Lockdown go to first available door. When state talking about possibility of arming teachers. Kids worried about teachers not handling guns as supposed to be handled. Afraid students will get ahold of gun.
- David Dupont mental health and stress of job kids don't think guns on campus a good idea.
- Doesn't make them feel safer, the fact that guns are involved, that school pushed to that point. So in danger.
- How get kids to take ownership of this fear? No place for hate. Kids helping each other feel more secure. Coalition. Kids who hold other kids accountable.
- Intermediate survey, in November? Related to sense of safety. Goal is percentage increase. Know if making progress.
- Initial survey, practices of social/emotional survey, then survey at end of semester.
- Survey worded differently feel unsafe in other places? Equally feel unsafe at the mall? What could we do to make you feel safer? Safe could mean from violence to bullying. How many of you woke up with a fear of shooting, terrorism? Nobody.

Student tardies: We're having some concerns with tardies. Kara Messer is often a volunteer in the front office.

• The most tardies are in the morning as school starts, and after lunch. It's not just seniors after lunch. Students from all grades are standing in the long line to get a tardy slip.

- We have a new Raptor system. The office attendant types in the students' excuses, exactly what they say.
- Seniors know that if accumulate too many tardies, will get their off-campus privileges taken away.
- The rest of the grades believe there are no consequences for tardies.
- Top tardies behavior contract, ISS, long term detentions at lunch. Going for positive reinforcement.
- Same kids over and again, a little of a problem.
- In mornings, no one is late because of the bus. Kara said too many in the mornings, raptor software freezes up and we have to hand-write. Bringing attention to students really tardy, all the time. a lot of really good info.
- Natural consequences from falling behind in class. Teachers have to turn them around, send to office. They don't like that. Have to wait in this long line at morning tardy, office. Time is stamped on the tardy pass. After first few days, aren't late anymore, understanding more the consequences.

Wearing of the IDs:

- Last week 3 non-students in the building last week. Then they bolt. Everyone here knows they need IDs. Kids didn't believe had to do it. Now, random ID checks. Thanks for having your ID! If not visible, usually in the backpacks. If they don't want one, immediately get fast track to the front of the line, get it printed.
- Visitors wearing a different color ID.

50th Anniversary Update:

- Non-profit created, Facebook, bank acct, t-shirt sales, building tours for graduates, review of yearbooks for memories. Our historian, Max Fisher Crockett's history. Bus accident died in 1972. Food trucks, entertainment.
